Discussion/Meditation Questions

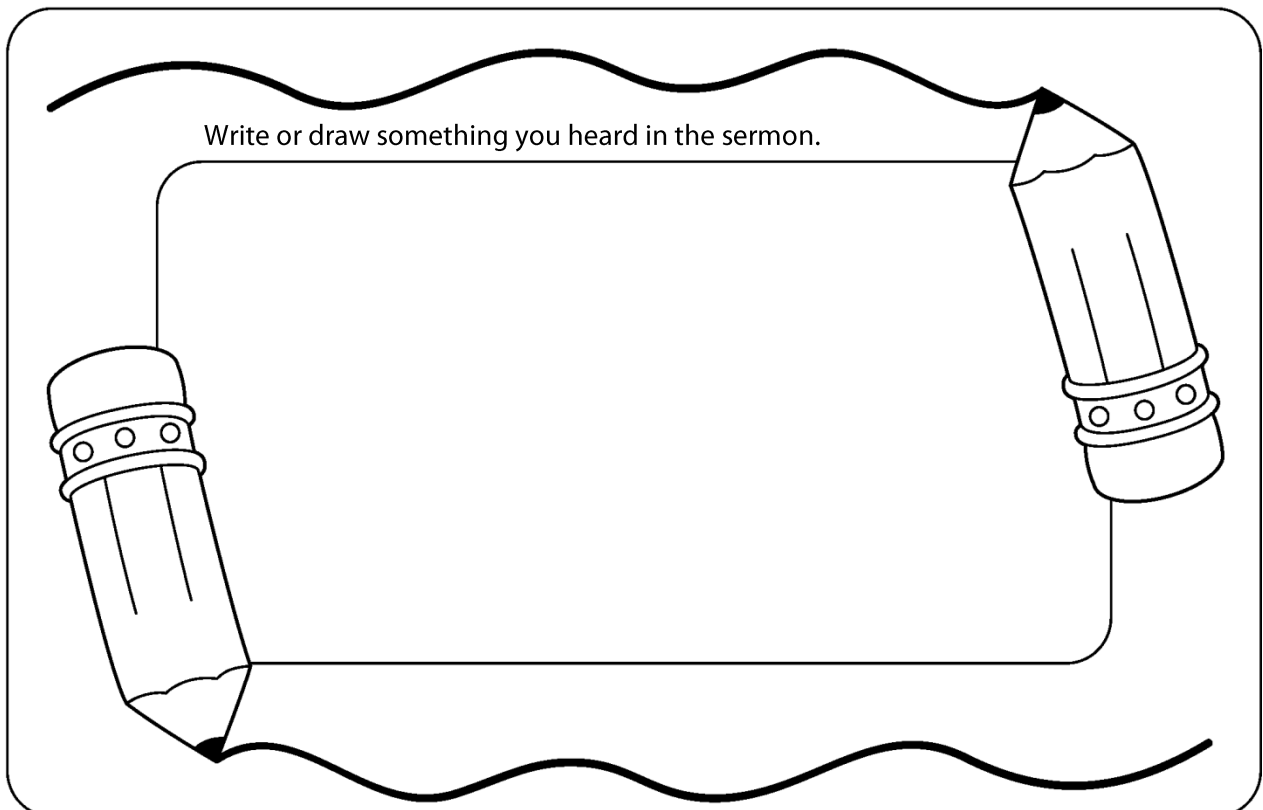
1. Jot down a list of why asking for our daily provision is difficult. What is it about your circumstances that you neglect to pray for and need to be diligent in asking the Lord to provide?
