- 1. What is the larger context or subject of this passage on head coverings?
  - a. Spiritual gifts and their proper use.
  - b. Food offered to idols.
  - c. Doing all things to the glory of God.
  - d. Divisions in the church.
- 2. Traditions are always bad and should be avoided. (Yes/No)
- 3. The meaning of head in verse 3 relates to authority. (Yes/No)
- 4. A person in a leadership role is more valuable that a person under their authority. (Yes/No)
- 5. According to this passage, both women and men can pray and prophesy. (Yes/No)
- 6. Circle the reasons given in the text for a woman to wear a head covering:
  - a. There is a difference between men and women that should be reflected in what they wear. This goes back to the creation of man and woman.
  - b. Women's hair is too beautiful that it's distracting and should be covered up.
  - c. A wife under the authority of her husband should wear a symbol of that authority.
  - d. A woman's glory (her hair) would rob God of his glory in worship and so her hair must be covered.
  - e. A sign of a woman's authority to pray in the church.
