## THE DOCTRINE OF GOD: THE GOD WHO LOVES

A threefold love of God is commonly held; or rather there are three degrees of one and the same love. First, there is the love of benevolence by which God willed good to the creature from eternity; second, the love of beneficence by which he does good to the creature in time according to his will; third, the love of complacency by which he delights himself in the creature on account o the rays of his image seen in them. The two former precede every act of the creature; the latter follows (not as an affect its cause, but as a consequent its antecedent). By the love of benevolence, he loves us before we were; by the love of beneficence, he loves us as we are; and by the love of complacency, he loves us when we are (viz., renewed after his image). By the first, he elects us; by the second, he redeems and sanctifies us; but by the third, he gratuitously rewards us as holy and just. John 3:16 refers to the first; Eph 5:25 and Rev 1:5 to the second; Is 62:3 and Heb 11:6 to the third.
