  - f. The Conquering King
3. The firstfruits is a metaphor derived from the OT where it denotes the first portion of the crop (or flock) which is offered in thanksgiving to God. (Yes/No)
4. Giving the firstfruits to God was expressing trust that the whole harvest would soon be coming. (Yes/No)
