#### **Lunch Questions (Food for Thought)**

#### Open your Bible, pick a partner, pick a question, and dig in!

- 1. Why does stories of courage (e.g., from WW2 or from Christian martyrs) give us such a sense that such courage is noble and good? It is important to live courageously ourselves and not simply to discuss the courage of others. Think of and share together of a time when you were bold for Christ.
- 2. Compile together what you believe to be important issues facing the church today in which clarity, boldness, and uncompromising proclamation of truth is essential. What Scriptural truths do these dangers jeopardize?
- 3. Think of and list other biblical sources of courage. Be sure to include the reference from Scripture.

### **Heeding God's Word Today and This Week**

" let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works"

- 1. **Today**: Consider how you can encourage a fellow family member in Christ to be courageous this week. Consider the different challenges people in our congregation face as you offer love and encouragement: being a Christian husband or wife; being a Christian father or mother; being married to an unbeliever; facing difficulties that come with age or sickness; facing pressure at school; facing pressure from friends; facing pressure at work; facing a difficult decision or transition; etc.
- 2. **This Week**: Meet a fellow church member for coffee (or before work or during lunch break). Ask them what issues they are facing that require prayers for courage. Pray for one another.
