The Foundation: God's Power

What's the most powerful thing you can think of?

The worlds most powerful engine weighs 2,300 tons, is 44 feet tall, and 90 feet long. It is a 14 cylinder diesel engine that has 109,000 horsepower. The engine powers a cargo ship that can carry 11,000 20-foot shipping containers at 31 knots from China to the US.

The worlds most powerful bite belongs to the salt-water crocodile. In a bite, it exerts 3,700 pounds per square inch (PSI) of force. This is twelve times stronger than the bite of a great white shark and means that it could crush bowling balls like we eat peanuts. (Humans can bite at the most about 120 pounds of force.)

The worlds most powerful creature is the blue whale who, at 150 tons of weight, can send a boat flying with just a flick of its tail.
