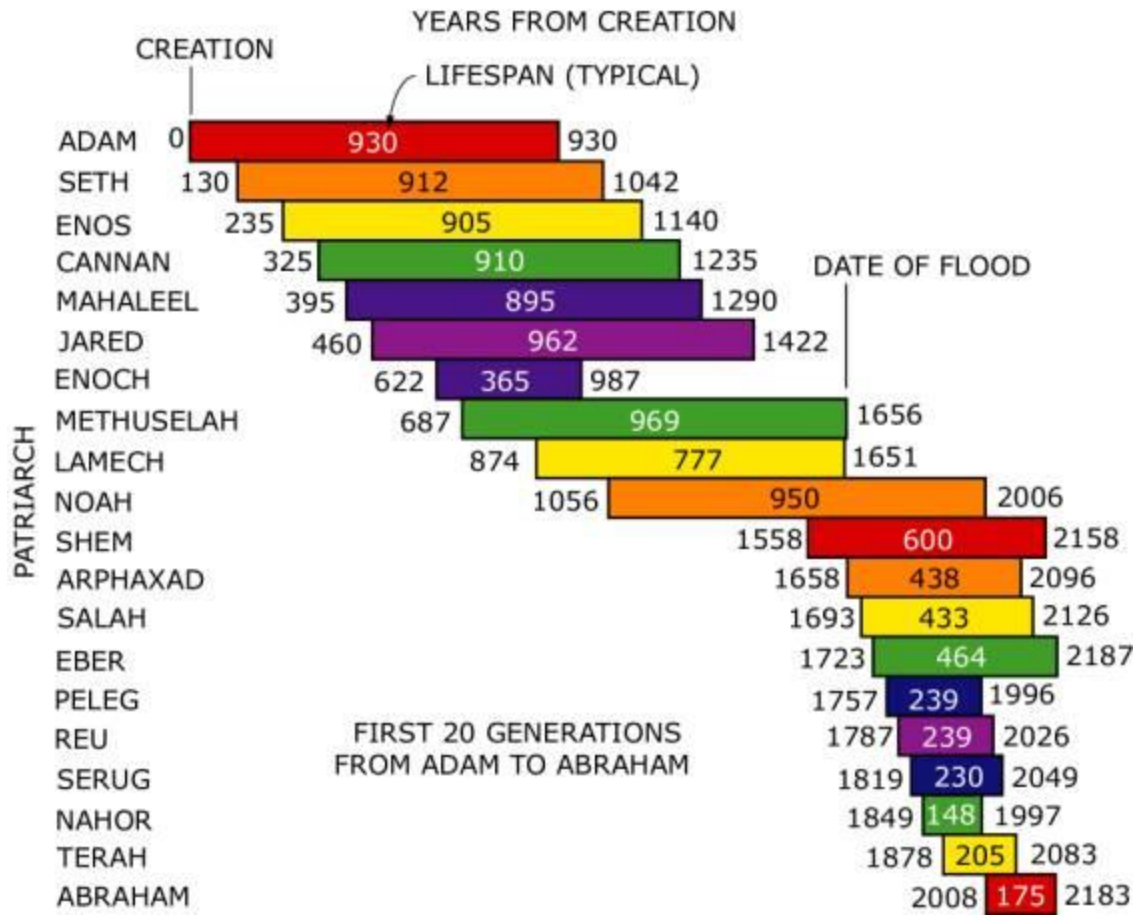


The Tower of Babel
