## Sermon Questions

2. Men would travel three times a year to Jerusalem for Passover, \_\_\_\_\_, and Tabernacles.
3. Why is the celebration called "Passover"?
  - i. It was a time of feasting where you would ask someone to "pass over" the food or drink.
  - ii. It was a remembrance of when the angel of death "passed over" Hebrew homes, sparing the firstborn son in Egypt.
  - iii. Passover is a Hebrew word meaning "yearly feast."

2. If Jesus was truly human, why did he not have a sinful nature? (see Hebrews 2:14–18; 4:14–16)

3. How would you answer a Muslim who tells you, “Jesus never said, ‘I am God, worship me.’”? (hint: see John 5, 8, 10).

4. What does it look like to trust Jesus? Is this the same as believing in Jesus?
