## Discussion Questions

1. The sermon gave seven reasons why it is important to study the book of Deuteronomy. Of those seven reasons, which is most convincing to you on why this book is important?
2. How does understanding that Deuteronomy is a series of sermons from the pastoral heart of Moses rather than a series of legal laws and bylaws impact our approach to this book and its relevance to Christians today?
3. The sermon challenges the idea that the Old Testament law is outdated or irrelevant, highlighting its role in revealing Christ and fostering godliness. What misconceptions about the Old Testament law have you held, and how does the sermon's perspective shift your understanding of its purpose?
4. Deuteronomy is presented as a covenant document outlining Israel's relationship with God. How can the concept of covenant shape your personal relationship with God, your family, or your church community?
5. What was your most significant take-away from this passage and sermon? Share this with another brother or sister in the fellowship.

## Discussion Questions for Children

1. The sermon says Moses shared God's words with the people, like a teacher or pastor. Why is it special to listen to God's words?
2. Deuteronomy mentions that a short 11-day trip took 40 years because the people didn't always obey God. Have you ever taken a long time to do something because you didn't listen? How can obeying God make things easier?
3. The sermon talks about how Deuteronomy tells the story of God's love and care for His people. What's your favorite Bible story where God helps or saves someone? How does it show that God loves us?
