4. The sermon mentions an ongoing spiritual conflict and cultural chaos. How can recognizing the reality of spiritual warfare, as described in Ephesians 6:11–12, equip you to navigate challenges in your personal life or society?
5. What was your most significant take-away from this passage and sermon? Share this with another brother or sister in the fellowship.

Discussion Questions for Children

1. The sermon talked about giants like Goliath and the Anakim in the Bible. What do you think it would be like to see someone as tall as a basketball hoop? Why do you think people were scared of them?
2. The sermon said there's a spiritual world with angels and God's power that we can't see. Why is it important to know it's real, even if we can't see it?
3. The sermon says Jesus won the biggest battle against evil, like David beat Goliath. How does knowing Jesus is stronger than any "giant" problem make you feel? What's one way you can ask Jesus for help this week?
